
Patriotic Instruction By Paul Johnson

"The Appleton Belle"

Research Material Supplied by Dennis Jacobs

The "Appleton Belle" was a steam boat designed to ply the Wisconsin River system. Built in Pittsburgh, Penn. in 1857, she was 134ft in length and had a 25ft beam, 103 tons and drew 20 inches of water and was a stern wheeler.

While no pictures exist of the "Appleton Belle" we present this sketch of the class.



"The beautiful steamer Appleton Belle – (so named in honor of the flourishing city of Appleton) –Capt. J. Nixon, arrived at this place from Pittsburg, via. Nashville, Tennessee, on Friday evening last. She remained here a short time, being detained by the unfinished lock at McNeil's Mill – This boat is designed to form one of a line of steamers to ply between Green Bay and Fond du Lac. She was built for the owners, Messrs. Nixon, Cotton & Co., at Pittsburg the past winter, and is as beautiful a specimen of mechanism as is often found afloat on out western waters, far exceeding anything now running on Lake Winnebago.

Under the excellent management of Capt. Nixon, she will undoubtedly be the favorite of the traveling public on her route. She is 134 feet in length with 25 feet beam draws about 20 inches of water, and modeled after the river steamers, with a stern wheel.


According to the *Portage City Record* "The Appleton Belle left Pittsburg about six weeks since and has made somewhat of a circuitous trip. Going down the Ohio River to the Cumberland mouth, she put up that river heavily laden, some two hundred miles to Nashville, in the middle of Tennessee. Re-loaded herself there with southern products, she again returned to the Ohio, passed down to the Mississippi, and so up to the Wisconsin, and from thence to Portage, being two days and a half from Prairie du Chien to this place. Thus we see we have a direct water communication with every State in the Union; the unimproved condition of the Wisconsin River being the only drawback. This will undoubtedly be shortly

remedied. The proprietors inform us that it is their purpose to build another boat the present summer to run between Oshkosh and Portage. If business or inclination leads us in the direction of Green Bay, mark us down for a trip on the Appleton Belle."

Mid-June of 1860, the Appleton Belle was sold and made her way to the Mississippi River, where she delivered coal and other supplies between St. Louis and Nashville. When the war broke out, she became a Confederate supply ship.

Nothing has been reported of the circumstances of her capture, however on 7 February 1862, a union gunboat "U.S.S. Conestoga under the command of Lt. S.L. Phelps, on the Tennessee River forced the rebel forces to abandon and destroy three steamers; Samuel Orr, Appleton Belle, and Lynn Boyd to prevent capture by the Union.



Burlington Daily Hawk Eye (Burlington Iowa) C. Dunham, February 14, 1862, Pg 3 Col. 3&4 further reports by the Gun Boats from the Tennessee River that; "Only one steamer, the Dunbar, now floats on the Upper Tennessee. The Appleton Belle had 4,000 pounds of powder aboard, and when fired was purposely anchored opposite the fine residence of Judge Creevatt, a noted loyalist, which was completely shattered by an explosion.

Compared to the Mississippi river boats which ranged from 200 to 300 feet with beams of 25 to 45 feet, drawing from 2 feet to 6 feet of water, the Appleton Belle was no means a glamorous queen of the river. Her size was demanded by the river systems she plied, large enough to take on the Mississippi, Ohio and Tennessee Rivers but the ability to transport cargo and people on the smaller, but numerous rivers that make up the Wisconsin river system, including the north flowing Fox river from Fond du Lac to Green Bay, the Wisconsin presumably from where it joins the Mississippi below Prairie du Chien. Filling a needs of early Wisconsin prior to the wide spread of the railroads after the Civil War. Had it not met her fate a mere 4 or so years after her launch, her usefulness past about 1870 would have been taken over by the rail roads.

#### OSHKOSH and the OLD ABE Camp

In 1885 the Old Abe Camp, located in Oshkosh, was the largest SUV camp in Wisconsin. Old Abe was the famous mascot of the 8th Wisconsin Infantry, popularly known as the Eagle Brigade, a unit heavily involved in the campaigns of the western armies. Old Abe the battle eagle became a real war hero - used for recruiting during the war's later years, attending veterans reunions for years after, and finally becoming a National icon for Wisconsin.
